7. Brief Description of Module (purpose, principal aims and objectives)

This module provides a foundation in research methodology and design in the field of counselling & psychotherapy. It supports the preparation, planning and initial review phases of students' research dissertations for the case study project. Students evaluate research methodology and its relationship to different perspectives in counselling & psychotherapy. This includes drawing on an opportunity as counselling students for critical reflexivity. This involves reflecting on and analysing own position, biases, and influences as a researcher throughout the study process. Critical reflexivity helps demonstrate awareness of how background, values, assumptions, and experiences shape research and interpretation of the case study.

Students will develop an understanding of processes, ethics, rationale, and strategies involved in undertaking research in counselling & psychotherapy. Students are required to engage in peer supervision groups and peer feedback tasks to support their learning on this module. Students must identify a topic for research which may be drawn from a variety of sources including research groups, personal experience, therapeutic practice, a lecturer-suggested topic or a professional subject of their specific interest (provided suitable academic supervision is available). They must then formulate a rationale for their study and develop a research question. Students must identify appropriate background literature to support their rationale and submit a research proposal together with their UCC ethics application. Students will present their work in progress to peers and tutor for formative feedback.

Students will have the following assessment options.

1. Option 1 Write a research proposal for systematic study of a topic of professional (counselling and psychotherapy-related) interest to them, including a brief literature review, rationale and research question(s), methodology, consideration of ethical issues, and a plan for completion of the study.
2. Option 2 Prepare a presentation to present to tutor in a “live” assessment that communicates a systematic study of a topic of professional (counselling and psychotherapy-related) interest to them, including a brief literature review, rationale and research question(s), methodology, consideration of ethical issues, and a plan for completion of the study. Students will be required to submit their framework for presentation on the same submission date as for students opting for option 1.
3. All students will complete the necessary research ethics application for UCC and submit with their proposal in readiness for their final research project (PDTR2)

Summary of Formative Assessment Plan

Students will work together in peer supervision groups and receive feedback on focus of research and methodology

Plan how they will conduct primary research in semester 2 with feedback from tutors and peers

Receive 2x20 minute tutorials: -

- previous feedback from year 2 reviewed.
- Samples of work (no more than 500 words) may be submitted for formative feedback.

Student presentations/posters (10 minutes) to peers – receive formative feedback from peers and tutor.
